
Instructor: James Iveson

The class will be focused on studying and remaking artists drawings from the 20 century till today. Time will be given to detailed looking at the drawings of artists including David Smith, Barnett Newman, Eva Hesse, Pierre Matisse, Agnes Martin, Raymond Pettibon, Ed Ruscha, Roger Herman, Pierre Bonnard, Fairfield Porter, Stanley Whitney, Emile Nolde. Students will attempt both individually and as a group to remake the drawings, gaining new understanding of the range of materials possibilities and cognitive choices. Repeated looking and analysis will help develop students ability to observe themselves drawing, and to develop their detail of perception.




