In this class, we will attempt to bring ourselves into the fundamentals of drawing technique and discourse. This includes exercises focused on learning the basics of materials preparation, and observation. The lessons we will perform should both help us learn about drawing (i.e. what is drawing? What would we like it to be?), and, at the same time, challenge and broaden our understanding of it. We will also learn to talk about the work we make in this class, as well as about other artists' work - both historical and contemporary.

#### **SESSION B** WEEK 1

### Monday

9:00 - 10:00: Check-in, introduction to the program and short tour of campus (Broad Art Center auditorium, Room 2160E)

10:00 - 11:00 Tour of studio and building facilities, review rules, Lab Supervisors give demonstrations 11:00 – 12:00: Review syllabus, make introductions, introductory presentation. To break the ice, we will go around the room and introduce ourselves briefly - saying our names, where we are from, why we are here, and a little bit about our interest in art. Everyone will be asked to name a work of art or an artist that they do like, and one that they do not.

12:00 –1:15 Lunch (Students get BruinCards)

1:15 - 3:30: Studio Time - Materials demo, make 50 drawings as an introduction to the class. Review daily studio clean-up procedure

3:30 - 3:45: Snack Break (Daily snack is offered compliments of the Summer Art Institute)

3:45 - 5:30: Continued studio time exercises

7:00- 10:00: Homework - write a paragraph about what drawing is

## **Tuesday**

12:00 - 1:15: Lunch 1:15 - 2:15: Artist Talk 2:00 - 4:45: We will make new drawing tools out of the tools that we already have available. For example, one might tape together two pencils to make mutant pencil. Students redraw still lifes with modified redraw instruments

Homework: make a drawing about your daily life on a scrap of brown paper
